

Great Basin Fieldwork Opportunity

The Applied Population Ecology Lab at the University of Nevada, Reno is currently seeking applications for **summer field technicians**. These positions are a major part of a long-term project monitoring wildlife communities in response to pinyon-juniper woodland removals in the Northern Great Basin.



Job Description

- Summer field technicians will go out to very remote areas for 7-14 days at a time to conduct small mammal trapping and reptile visual encounter surveys.
- Weeks not in the field will be dedicated to data entry, equipment repair, and specimen prep.
- Due to the extreme conditions of our field sites, field technicians are required to volunteer 1-3 weeks before being qualified for paid positions.
 - Food will be provided for everyone.
- Paid positions receive a stipend of \$450 a week.
- There is no commitment to a minimum number of weeks, but technicians with the greatest flexibility will be given highest priority.

Qualifications

- Live in remote conditions without access to running water, refrigeration, or internet.
- Carry packs of equipment for multiple miles a day through dry sagebrush habitat.
- Keep a positive attitude in adverse conditions.
 - Problem solve independently.

To Apply:

- ★ Finally, all interviews will be conducted by the end of April.
- ★ Field preparation starts at the beginning of May.
- ★ The field season runs May 16 – the end of September 2019.
